Introduction

Softball Ireland is committed to making softball an inclusive sport, for all. From time to time this may require some adaptations to the WBSC rules, Softball Ireland Regulations, or the regional byelaws, which ordinarily govern the sport. The utmost care is taken not to alter the level playing field in providing opportunity and observing people's rights. We would encourage organisers, officials, and players to adopt the following alterations regarding gender identification, where necessary. We ask that no member creates an uncomfortable or unwelcoming environment by questioning any player regarding their gender identity. Softball should continue to be played in the spirit of sport, allowing for a safe and fun environment for all players.

The current rules allow for the genders of male and female. These adaptations will define gender as male (M), female (F) and non-binary (NB). This is defined with the understanding that non-binary players identify neither as male or female and transgender players may identify anywhere along this spectrum. Players who identify as a gender, in their daily lives, will participate under the WBSC rules for that gender. A player is required to confirm their gender at registration and may not change over the course of a season.

Softball Ireland respects the gender identity of players. It is the stated policy of Softball Ireland that a player shall not be asked to confirm their gender once it has been noted on the roster.

Where a non-binary player is identified in the line-up this should be communicated during the pre-game meeting to facilitate the following adaptations.

Rules to be adapted (Slowpitch)

1. Batting Order

Players must alternate M/F until this is no longer possible: (SI adaptation 6+4)

Adaptation: Batting order will follow the same order but also including NB i.e., M/F/NB the following examples should assist. How the battling order finishes out will depend on the number of male and female players on the team. Any extra hitters must be of different genders using the above definition. A NB player may bat either 3, 6, 9 or 10 in the batting order.

Batting Order Examples:

2. Fielding Positions

Defensive Outfield must consist of a maximum of 2 players from any one gender and the defensive infield must consist of a maximum of 2 players from any one gender.

Adaptation: Non Binary is to be added as a gender with the rule acting as normal thereafter

3. Batting

Male batters will be pitched the 12" ball and female batters the 11" ball.

Adaptation: Non-binary players will choose prior to the game/tournament which ball they would prefer to hit. This choice will be confirmed on the line-up shared at the plate conference prior to the game and the player's choice will remain in effect for the duration of the game.

4. Walks

Batter must advance to 1st base when 4 balls are called by the umpire. In Co-ed, any walk to a male batter, intentional or otherwise, will result in a two-base award.

Adaptation: The umpire will determine whether a player should take one base or two bases on a walk in relation to the ball size chosen to be hit by the non-binary player.

If there are two outs and a male batter is walked a proceeding female batter will bat, except if there are two out, the female batter has the option to walk or bat.

Adaptation: If there are two out and a player hitting a 12" ball is walked the next batter can choose to walk to first base if they are hitting an 11" ball.

5. Substitutions

Any substitute must be of the same gender as the substituted player.

Adaptation: Non binary players may be substituted by, or for, another player of the same or a different gender, provided that the rules for overall player numbers and fielding restrictions are met. This may result in consecutive genders in the line-up. This is permitted. If a Non Binary player is being introduced as a substitute the captain must confirm which size ball the substitute will hit.

Additional Information

Softball Ireland understands that some players may have some concerns around these adaptations, and we are happy to facilitate any further information needed. This should not allow any player to act in a way which infringes on the dignity of a fellow player or official. There have been concerns relating to cisgender men pertaining to be transgender, transgender women having an unfair advantage or the potential for a non-binary player to have an advantage; our response is to outline that the abuse of inclusion measures in this way would not be accepted by the softball community, and we are confident in our members character that they would not be so flippant with issues facing members of our community. The perceived advantage that may be gained is minor in relation to creating an opportunity to practice inclusion in our sport.

This is a living document and may change over time, and with further collaboration and advice.
